### *Time Running Out to Mail Your Ballot!*

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez would like to remind voters that there is only a short time remaining to mail back their vote-by-mail ballot and ensure that it will be received by 7 pm on November 2, 2010. As an alternative, voters are urged to bring their voted vote-by-mail ballot sealed in the signed affidavit envelope, directly to the Recorder's office, or to an Early Voting Site or drop it off at any polling location on the day of the Election, Tuesday, November 2, 2010.

"If they do not get their vote-by-mail ballot in the U.S. mail by Friday, October 29<sup>TH</sup>, there will be a high risk of the ballot not reaching our office in time," stated Ms. Rodriguez. "Don't take that chance. The vote-by-mail ballot must be in our possession by 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Postmarks do not count."

Voters also should NOT take the chance of giving their vote-by-mail ballot to a stranger. "There are well-meaning campaign workers who are knocking on doors, and they are offering to deliver voters' ballots to the Recorder's office for them," said Ms. Rodriguez. "Unless you know and trust the person, don't hand your vote-by-mail ballot over to a stranger to deliver."

Early Voting Sites are also open and able to accept completed Vote-by-Mail ballots on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday during regular hours AND on Saturday, October 30<sup>th</sup> between 9 AM and 2 PM. This includes **all** Early Voting Sites for weekday drop-off this week, but only the Northwest site at the NW YMCA (7770 N Shannon Rd), the Mid-Town Site at Sacred Heart Church (601 E Ft Lowell Rd), the Southside site at the Recorder's Early Ballot Processing Center (6550 S Country Club Rd) and in the Sahuarita/Green Valley area at Sahuarita Town Hall (375 W Sahuarita Center Way) as well as the Recorder's Offices on Saturday, 10/30.

Recorder's office staff will be available for phone calls on Saturday, 11/30/10, as well as regular business hours on Monday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, and between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 2, 2010.

For those voters who will be going to their polling location to vote on Tuesday, Ms. Rodriguez strongly recommends that they be prepared: Find out where your polling location is, have patience, and expect lines.
