Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez would like to remind voters that time is quickly running out to register to vote for the November 4, 2008 General Election. The cut-off to register to vote in the General Election is midnight, **MONDAY, OCTOBER 6, 2008.**

“The Recorder’s office is in a continual process of cleaning up our voter registration rolls, and we are discovering that there are many “missing” voters who have moved within Pima County but have not updated their residence address with our office” said Ms. Rodriguez. “If you have moved recently and not updated your voter registration, we are looking for you.”

If you are not sure you are registered to vote, please call our office at (520) 740-4330 to confirm your registration. “Citizens of Pima County, this is a very important election, and we need to have all citizens who are eligible to vote participating in this and future elections,” urged Ms. Rodriguez. “This is the time to have your voice be heard.”

A new voter registration form must be completed by anyone who has moved (even to a new apartment number in the same complex), changed their name since their last registration, is a new Pima County resident, or would like to change their party affiliation.

Forms may be obtained at the Pima County Recorder's office, any Arizona Department of Motor Vehicle branch, all post offices and libraries, political party headquarters, and city/town halls. Voters may also log onto the Recorder's office web site at [www.recorder.pima.gov](http://www.recorder.pima.gov) and download a form to complete and mail in, or click on the link called "EZVOTER" for the online Motor Vehicle Division voter registration system. Or, voters may also log onto [servicearizona.com](http://servicearizona.com) to access the site directly. For more information, voters may call the Pima County Recorder's office at 740-4330. Out-of-town residents may call 1-800-775-7462 and ask for extension 4330.

In addition, we are accepting vote-by-mail ballot requests for the November 4, 2008 General Election, and will continue accepting them until the deadline of 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 24, 2008.

Voters who are either signed up for the Permanent Early Voting List or have already ordered their early ballot will automatically receive their General Election ballot, and do not need to request a ballot at this time. Ballots for the General Election will be mailed out beginning October 2, 2008. Anyone who is unsure if their ballot is on order may call our office at 740-4330 to check.

Request a vote-by-mail ballot now for the November 4, 2008 General Election by calling the Pima County Recorder's office at (520) 740-4330. Out-of-town residents may call 1-800-775-7462 and ask for extension 4330. Voters may also log onto the Recorder's web site at [www.recorder.pima.gov](http://www.recorder.pima.gov) and either request a ballot online, or download a vote-by-mail request to complete and mail in.
