Order Your Vote-By-Mail Ballot Now!

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez would like to remind voters that early voting for the November 4, 2008 Presidential Election is now in full swing.

“Early voting has become an extremely popular way to vote in elections,” stated Ms. Rodriguez. “As of this date, we have already processed 205,000 requests for early ballots. This is an unprecedented volume for Pima County.”

There are two methods for voting early. The first method is to order a ballot to be mailed to your home. The ballot can be voted in the comfort and privacy of your home, without the need to rush to free up the voting booth for the next voter in line. When the ballot is voted, it can simply be placed in the white affidavit envelope, the affidavit signed by the voter, and then placed in the yellow postage-paid return envelope and mailed back to the Pima County Recorder’s office.

Voters who are on the Permanent Early Voting List will automatically receive a ballot in the mail, and do not need to request one.

The other method for voting early is to visit any one of the satellite early voting sites throughout Pima County (*for media, please refer to list of early voting sites attached*). “We have placed these sites around Pima County so that, no matter where you live, there is a convenient

walk-in early voting site somewhere,” said Ms. Rodriguez. “For this important election, we are even opening our sites on some Saturdays to accommodate voters who can’t get to an early voting site during the work week.”
