Too Late to Mail Your Ballot

For information about polling place ID requirements, please contact the Pima County Division of Elections at (520) 351-6830, or visit their web site at www.pima.gov/elections.

Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez would like to remind voters that if they have not yet mailed back their vote-by-mail ballot, they should either bring it directly to the Recorder's office or drop it off at any polling location on the day of the Election, Tuesday, November 4, 2008.

"If they did not get their vote-by-mail ballot in the U.S. mail by Friday, October 31st, there would be a high risk of the ballot not reaching our office in time if they were to mail it now," stated Ms. Rodriguez. "Don't take that chance. The vote-by-mail ballot must be in our possession by 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4th. Postmarks do not count."

Voters also should NOT take the chance of giving their vote-by-mail ballot to a stranger. "There are well-meaning campaign workers who are knocking on doors, and they are offering to deliver voters' ballots to the Recorder's office for them," said Ms. Rodriguez. "Unless you know and trust the person, don't hand your vote-by-mail ballot over to a stranger to deliver."
