## Sunnyside School District Recall Election

### VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT RETURNS

The Sunnyside School District is conducting a recall election for governing board members on May 20, 2014. Pima County Recorder, F. Ann Rodriguez reports that **26,424** ballots have been mailed to the registered voters in the Sunnyside School District. The Sunnyside School District Recall Election is an all vote-by mail election, so all registered voters in the Sunnyside School District should have received a ballot.

If a voter has not received their ballot, has spoiled their ballot or has lost their ballot, they can call the Recorder's office at 724-4330 or stop by either the Recorder's downtown location at 115 N. Church Avenue or the location at 6550 S. Country Club Road to order a replacement ballot. Completed ballots can also be dropped off at either of these locations.

**2,767** ballots have been signature verified by the Recorder's office as of today, May 7, 2014. This is a return rate of **10.47%**. Voters are reminded that ballots must be received by the Recorder's office no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 20, 2014. If you would like to mail your ballot back, we recommend mailing no later than Friday, May 16, 2014.

To check the status of a vote-by-mail ballot, voters can go to the Recorder's website at [www.recorder.pima.gov](http://www.recorder.pima.gov), click on the Early Ballot Status link and put in their name and date of birth. The system will tell the voter if their ballot has been received, signature verified and turned over to Elections for tabulation.

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On Election Day, May 20, 2014, replacement ballots may be obtained for voters who have not received a ballot, have lost their ballot or spoiled their ballot and vote-by-mail ballots can be dropped off at any of the following sites:

- The Recorder's Main Office – 115 N. Church Avenue open 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 20, 2014
- The Recorder's Office Ballot Processing facility – 6550 S. Country Club Road open 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 20, 2014
- Apollo Middle School – 265 W. Nebraska Street open 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 20, 2014

All three of these Replacement Ballot Sites, including Apollo Middle School, will be staffed by Recorder's Office personnel on Election Day, May 20, 2014.
