Do You Know Where to Drop Off Your Ballot by Mail on Election Day?

2017-November Consolidated Election

Election Day is Tuesday, November 7, 2017. Pima County Recorder, F. Ann Rodriguez stated, "Voters can drop off their voted Ballot by Mail ballot at any voting location in the valley."

However, if a voter needs a new ballot for reasons such as: mismarked ballot, lost ballot or voter moved, voters **must** go to their designated voting location and vote a ballot in person.

Registered voters in Pima County can find their voting locations by going to www.recorder.pima.gov and following the yellow highlighted link on the home page or by calling the Pima County Recorder's Office at 724-4330.

Oro Valley is conducting a polling place election. Oro Valley voters **MUST** go to their assigned polling locations to vote on Election Day. If Oro Valley voters have questions regarding polling locations they are urged to contact the Pima County Recorder at 724-4330 or go to www.recorder.pima.gov and click on [Polling Location](#).
